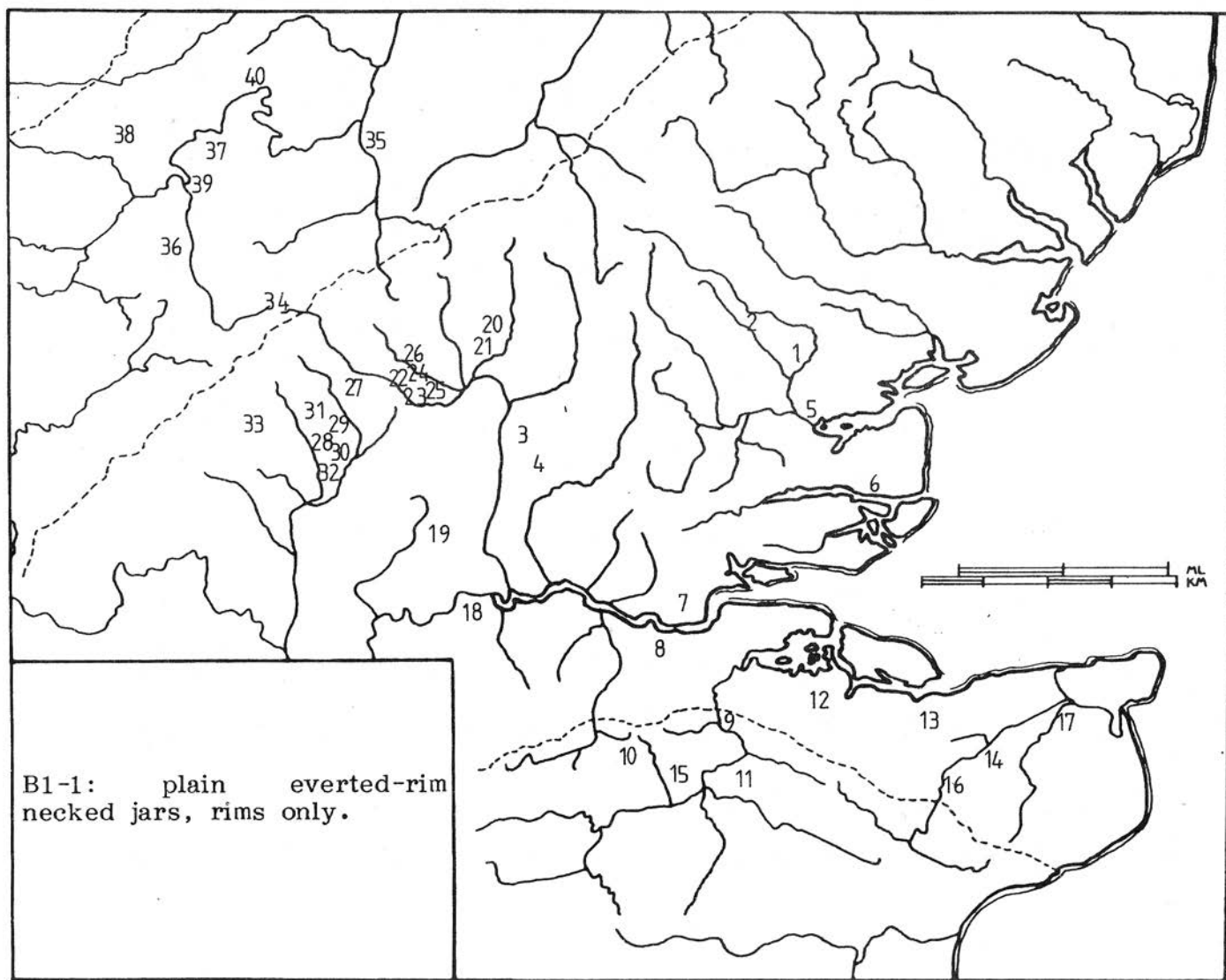


B1-1: PLAIN EVERTED-RIM NECKED JARS: RIMS ONLY

The B1 group is of plain everted-rim jars, very simple and often quite elegant. Rims only are included here, of which insufficient remains to be certain of the form of the whole jar, and so not assigned to any of the other forms in the B1 group. It is not always certain how large or small they are; cf. bowls, D1-1; cups, E3-1; and pedestalled, F1-1.

Notes

This is found everywhere from the later 1st century BC at Braughing until well past the Roman conquest; versions of the later 1st century AD in Roman grey wares are common enough. The Braughing contexts show the emergence of the form in features

that still contain crude HM Iron Age wares. It should not be forgotten that these examples are rims only, and their complete forms unknown.

The Borden rim is flint-gritted but wheel-made (see Zone 5).

See also Wards Coombe occupation debris fig.3 no.20, from the trenches. It seems to be grog-tempered but the context is unclear.

Note the tendency to upright rims in Kent.
