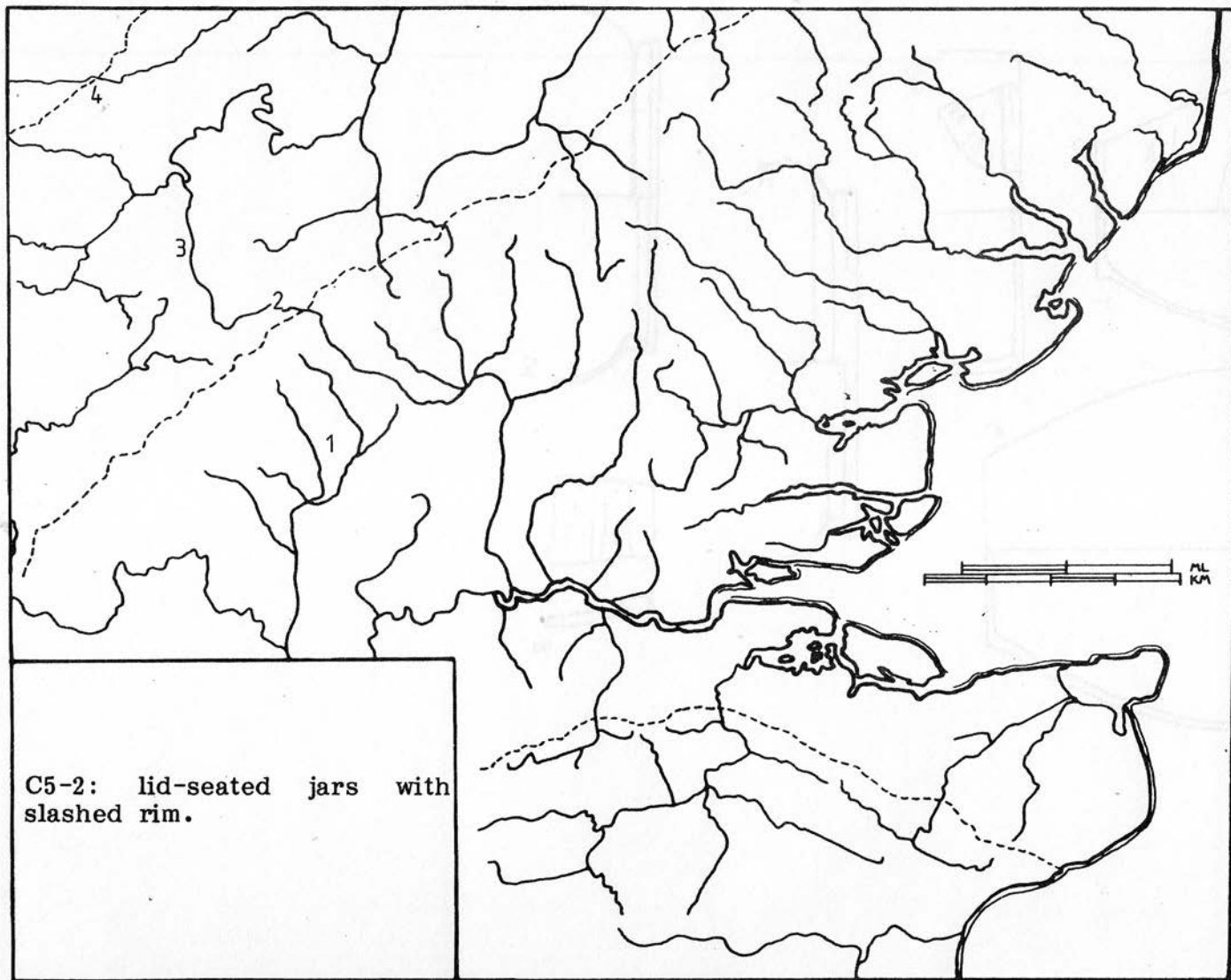


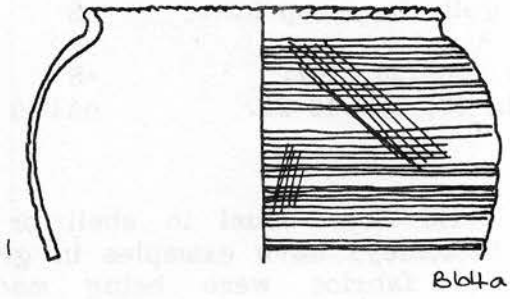
C5-2: LID-SEATED JARS WITH SLASHED RIM

4	Northampton, Camp Hill kiln 18, nos.16-21.	cAD50 ▲

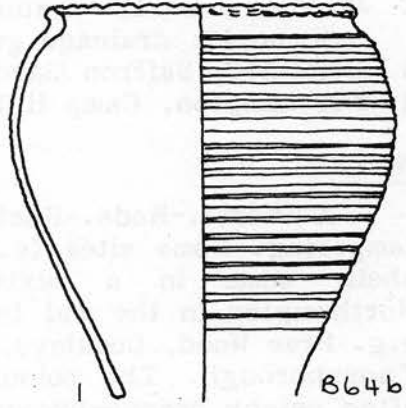
Notes

A Herts.-Beds.-Bucks, form more usual in shell or sand tempering. Some sites (e.g. Bletchley) have examples in grog or shell; some in a mixture of fabrics were being made at Northampton in the mid 1st century AD. Shelly versions appear at e.g. Prae Wood, Lockleys, Sherington, Newport Pagnell, Bletchley, Thornborough. The colour of the form, whatever the fabric, is often patchy orange-brown-grey.

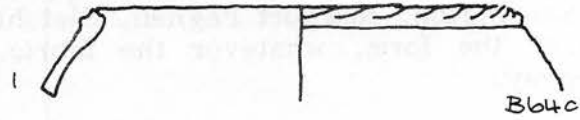




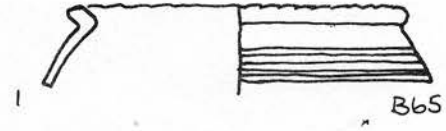
