Notes

The distribution map shows the very local nature of this form; some larger examples are in form B3-5. There is a shell-tempered version, possibly mixed with grog, at Bromham, Beds., and a gritty Roman one at Duston, Northants., but it is not found at the mid-1st century AD" sites in the area at Northampton, Hardingstone, etc. The Braughing pot shows its early beginnings; it does not appear to survive the conquest, although it may cover most of the period 15 BC to AD 43.
