

## SECTION F: PEDESTALLED JARS, BOWLS, AND CUPS

Several of the standard bowl and cup forms have pedestalled versions, although they are not as common as the unpedestalled originals and form no kind of developmental sequence. They are quite separate from the pedestal urn series. For these reasons they have been placed together in their own section, so that the whole range can be seen in one place. Inevitably they are not common, as so much of the vessel has to survive to be sure it belongs here; some of the rims in, say, the E1-2 section might have had pedestals. On the whole the proportion presented here of pedestalled to non-pedestalled is probably not unreasonable, since there are no large numbers of spare bases that appear to have belonged to F forms; but some of the A bases may have done so, and a category is provided here also for spare bases.

Section F comprises:

- F1-1 pedestalled plain bowls with everted rim and offset neck.
- F1-2 pedestalled round jars, plain and without offset.
- F2 pedestalled bowls, squat and elaborately cordoned.
- F3-1 carinated pedestalled bowls, plain.
- F3-2 pedestalled version of the carinated cup E1-1.
- F3-3 very large curving version of F3-2.
- F3-4 pedestalled version of E1-2.
- F3-5 tall narrow cordoned pedestalled beakers.
- F4 small pedestalled bowls with splayed rim.
- F5 pedestal bases that are not from pedestal urns.
