

G1-7: COPIES GALLO-BELGIC FORM Cam.12, WITH STRAIGHT OR CONVEX OUTSPLAYED WALL AND ONE INTERNAL OFFSET

This and the following two forms are difficult to disentangle: they are all forms that developed into Roman versions as the 1st century AD progressed.

Notes

Cam.12, always TN, is more common at Sheepen than abroad, where it is mostly Claudian (Hawkes & Hull 1947, 219). Sheepen had so many originals that it did not need many copies; both begin before the conquest. By the third quarter of the 1st century AD Roman versions appear (e.g. Braintree, site 10, no.38, with parallels at Chelmsford).
