The following is a small collection of miniature vessels that do not easily relate to normal forms. A list is given also of examples of other forms that are miniatures. Some are so small that it is impossible to be sure of the fabric.

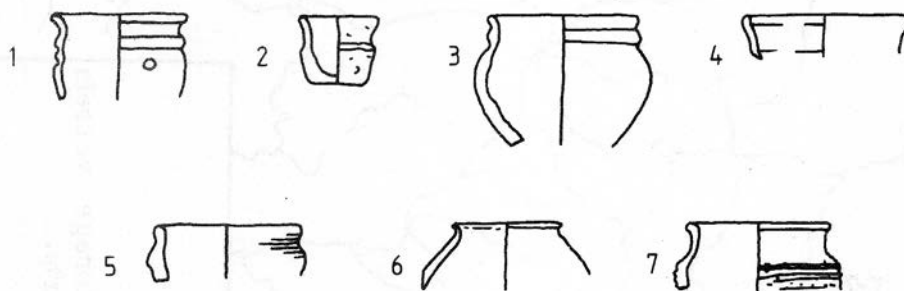
E3-1, Prae Wood (two): [677], Zero Ditch; [427], LIIIa Grey Clay.

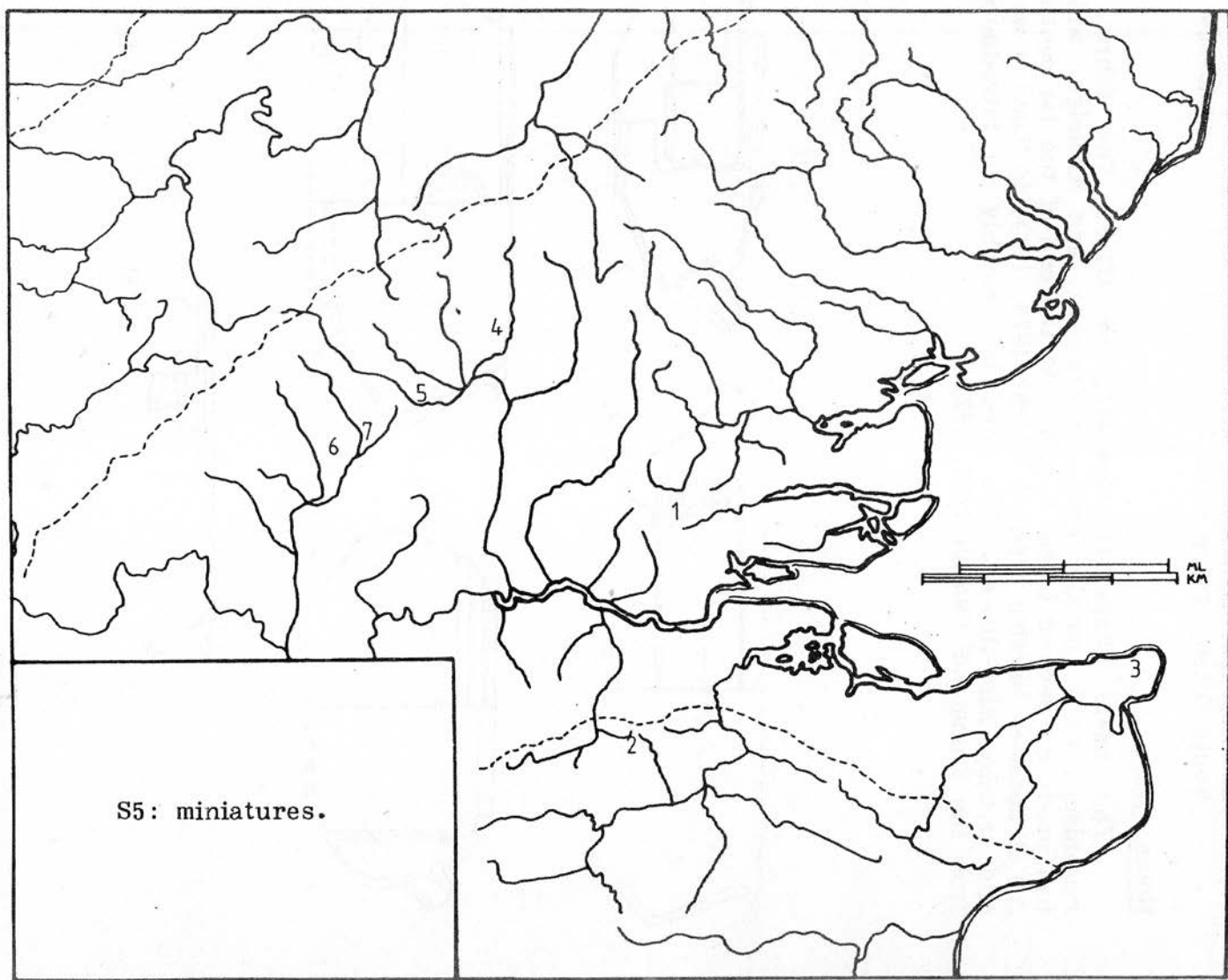
G4, Prae Wood (three): [468], [549], Wheeler's no.33B. All enclosure A ditch Grey Clay.

Notes

Prae Wood has the greatest variety of form, but I am not sure that this is important. Some are hard to recognise, being mere slivers from very small vessels, and many must go unnoticed. A few have been found in recent excavations at Canterbury (inf. N. Macpherson-Grant).
