

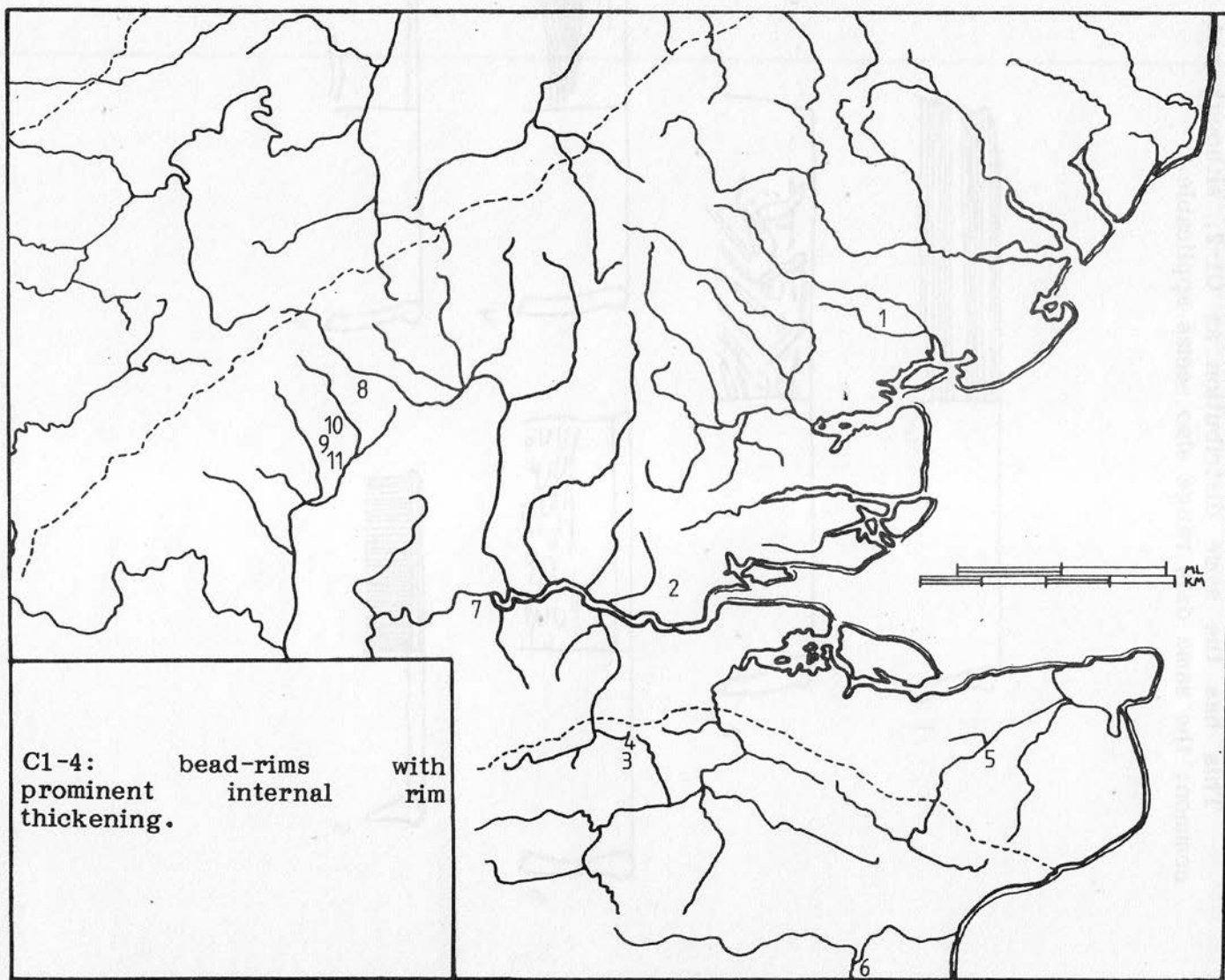
C1-4: BEAD-RIMS WITH PROMINENT INTERNAL RIM THICKENING

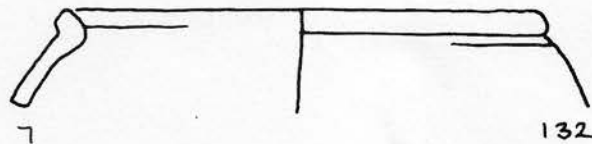
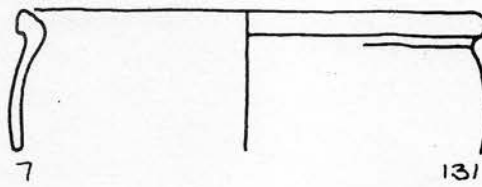
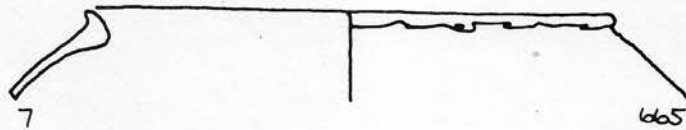
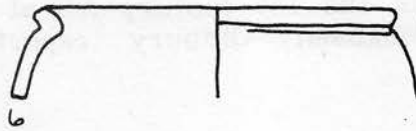
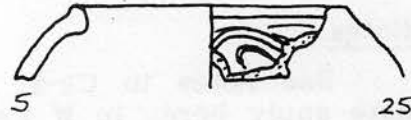
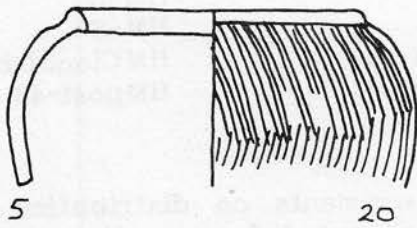
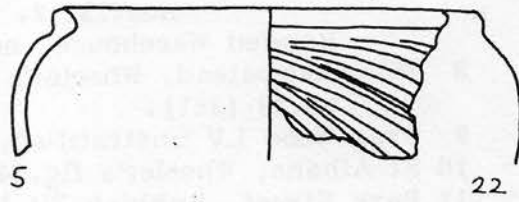
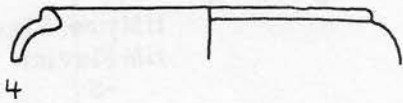
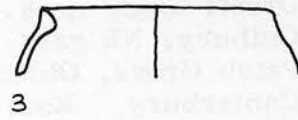
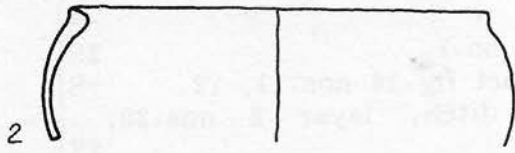
