

C6-2: GLOBULAR STORAGE JARS WITH SLASHED SHOULDER,
ROMANISED

See below: this does not include all storage jars with slashed or stabbed shoulder decoration.

Notes

All of these are romanised, even when grog-tempered. The stabbing on the shoulder is not common on the C6-1 form, although it does occur; these C6-2 jars are contemporaries of a large thick Roman version of C6-1 with deep and strong stabbing on the shoulder (see notes to C6-1). The Welwyn vessel here is possibly from Welwyn Grange Roman cemetery; the Henderson Collection of Braughing material has much 1st century BC pottery, but also a lot of Roman, all unstratified.
