## Notes

This form also occurs in Iron Age fabrics in earlier contexts; that illustrated by Ince (1928, 94, b) is flint-gritted. Cf. Burnham-on-Crouch (C. Couchman 1977a, 75, & fig.15), also flint-gritted, and Late Bronze/Early Iron Age in southern Britain and northern France according to John Barrett. The form seems to persist until it turns up in grog in the first century AD. See also Oare (Swan 1975), fig.3 no.24.
