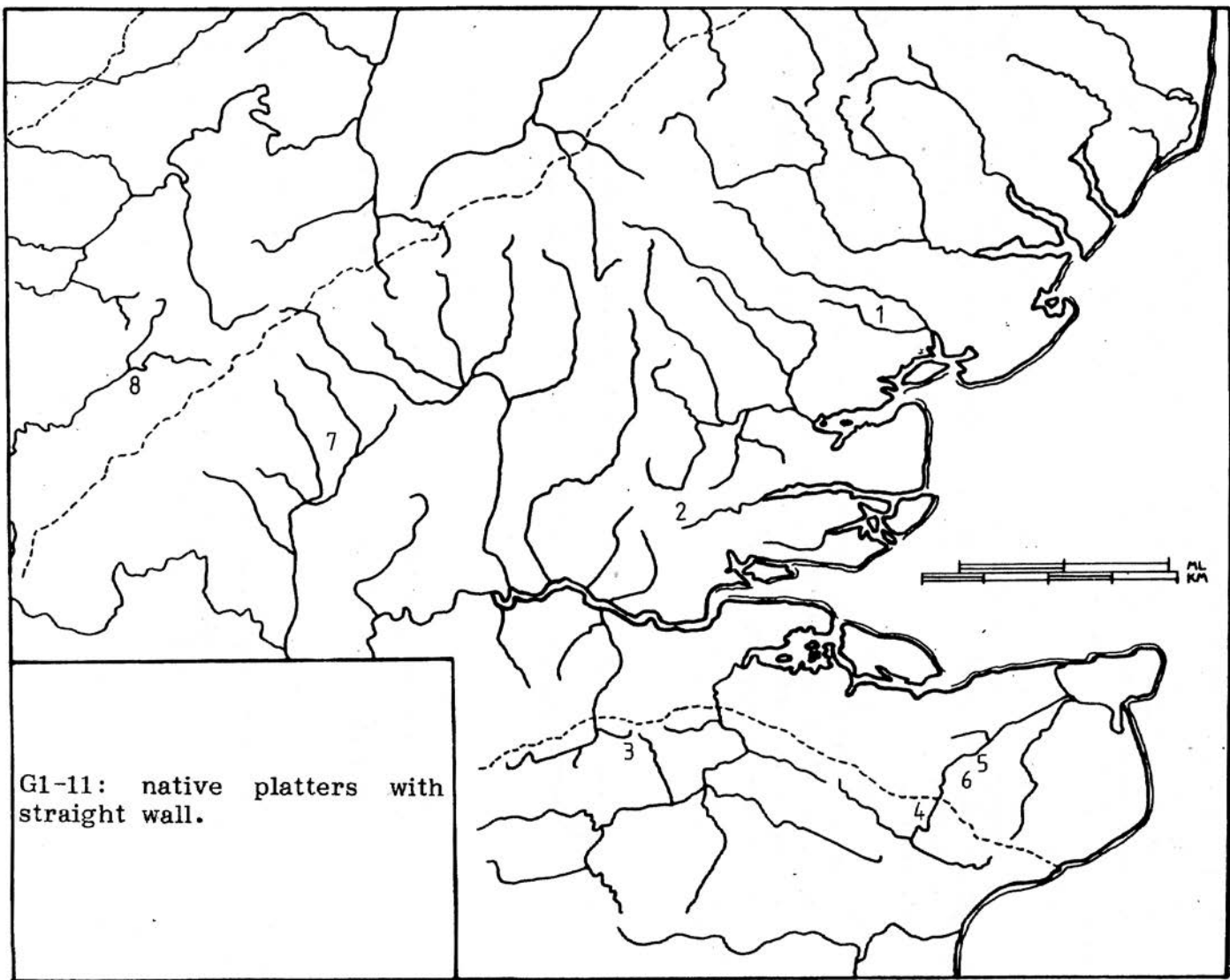
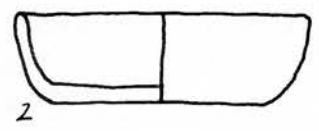
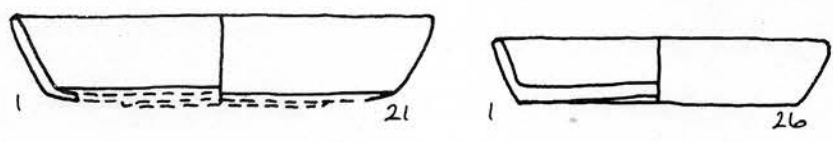
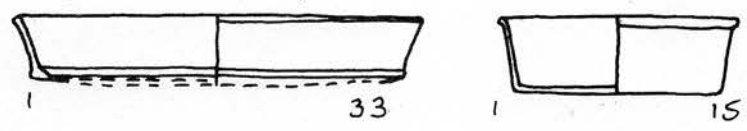
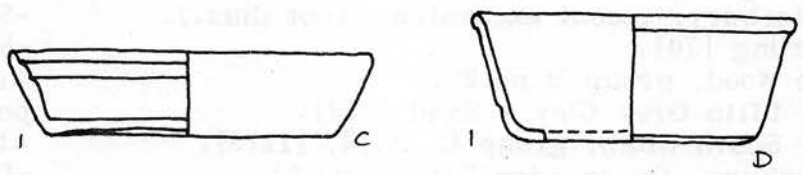
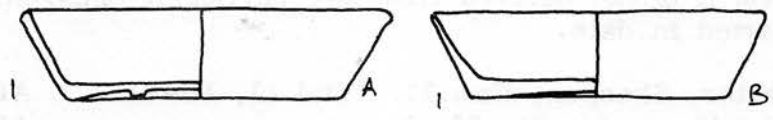
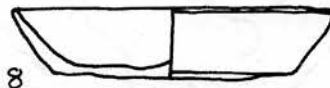
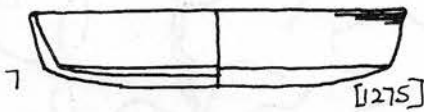
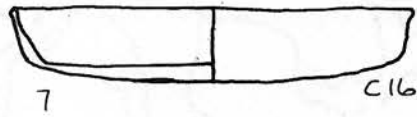
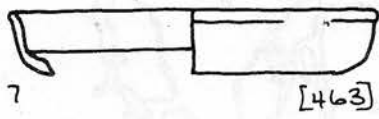
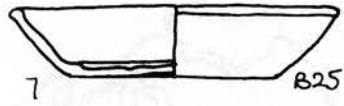
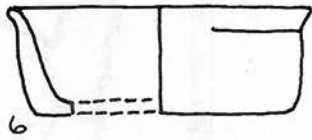
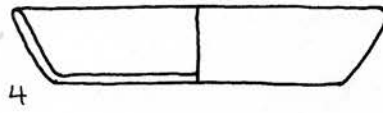
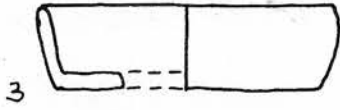


PLATE I. BOWLS WITH STRAIGHT WALLS.
