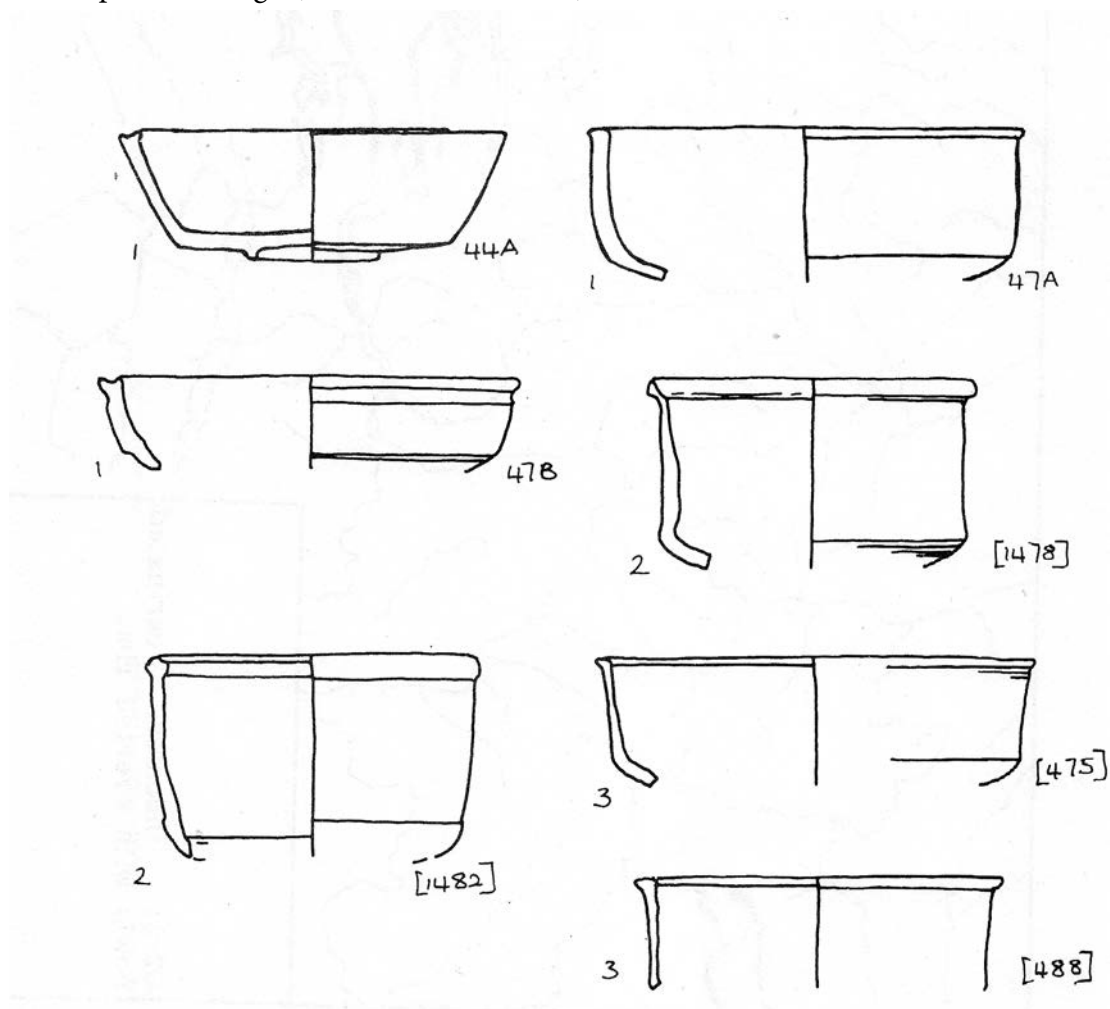

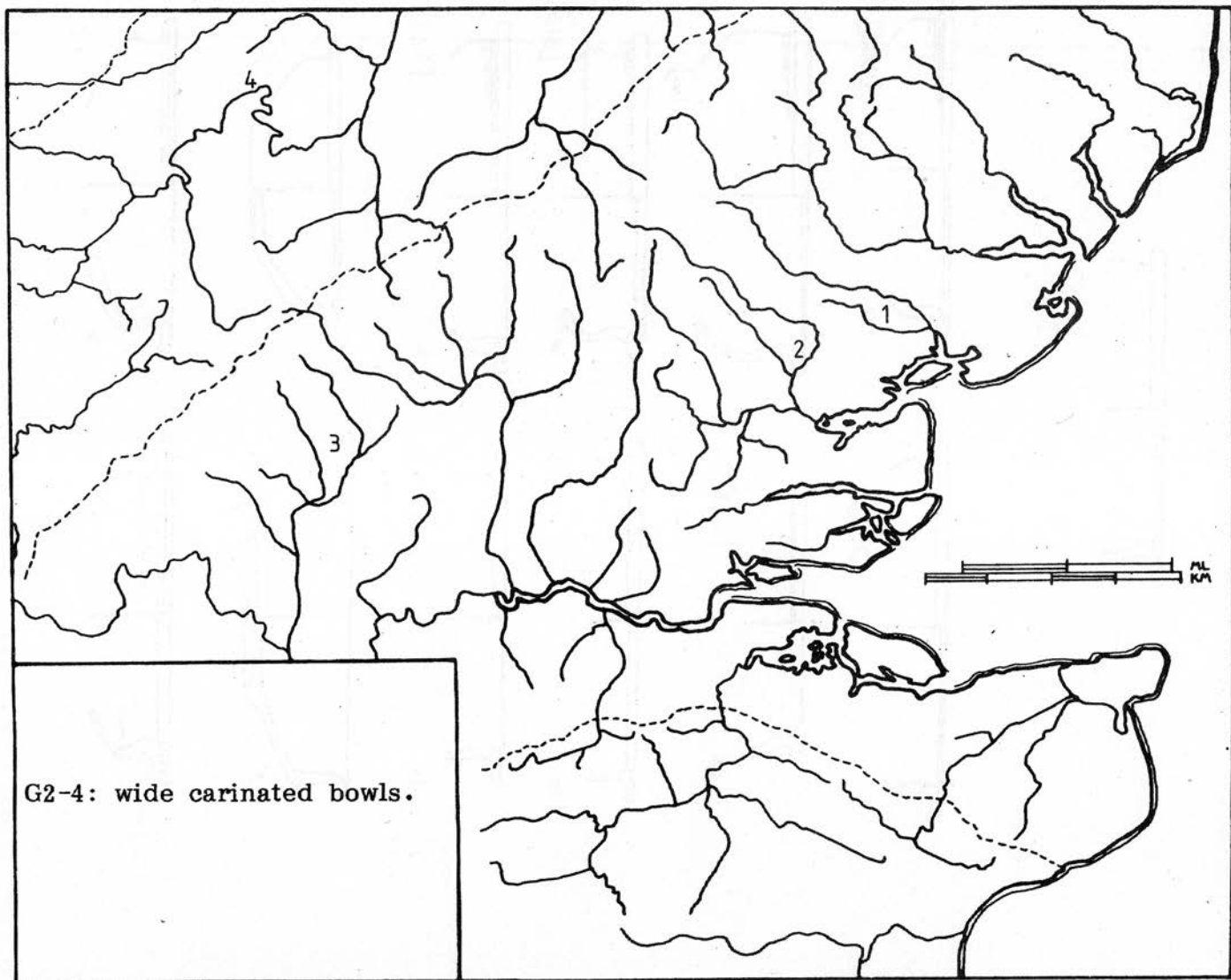
Notes

These are native ware copies and variants of early scarce forms that are Roman and romanising at Sheepen, and not connected with the Gallo-Belgic series: they do not seem to have continental originals, although Cam.44A has a vague similarity to the shape of Drag.29. Their loose connection with the start of the Roman series explains their oddity and individuality.

Cam .47B is similar (but deeper and with a grooved rim) to a platter from Prae Wood in G1-10.

The odd pair from Kelvedon is somewhat reminiscent of no.35 in the Vincennes Farm pit at Ardleigh (Erith & Holbert 1974).
