
## G5-6: BUTT-BEAKER. RIMS AND FRAGMENTS

It is often possible to see whether these are from barrel-shaped or offset butt-beakers, but not enough remains to say if the pot was plain or decorated. Only a selection is illustrated.

## Notes

As shown by the more complete butt-beaker forms, the date range for grog-tempering in butt-beakers appears to run to c.AD 50.

the Birchington pot is romanised;
the Northampton Camp Hill rim is in the local mixed fabric of grog with quartz, ironstone, and shell, and the Moulton Park rim is also a mixture of grog and shell.
